



Why plan for 30 years from now? The purpose for a Statewide Long Range Plan vision.


Why Plan?

- The plan will document the most pressing transportation priorities for Massachusetts to address between now and 2050.














Beyond Mobility – the Process



Accounting for Existing Plans


- The Beyond Mobility Plan Inventory includes data from 68 plans & policies
- Through those inventories Barriers & Recommendations are being identified and mapped across multiple categories, including:
 - Safety
 - Roadways
 - Public Transportation
 - Active Transportation
 - Airports
 - Good Movements
- This will culminate in a needs assessment indicating specific sites that are still in need of investment








How often do you participate in transportation or community plans?



1,107 responses to the first survey available in Chinese, French, Haitian Creole, Portuguese, Spanish, Vietnamese, and English


Phase I Survey Responses by Zip Code














Migration Into and Out of Massachusetts by Year






